ORDER MODIFYING THE ORDER

Respondent

On January 20, 1999, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than five years, with provision for consecutive three month stays of the suspension contingent upon compliance with a number of conditions and limitations on the license. Among other conditions, Dr. Darcy was required to enroll and successfully participate in a drug and alcohol treatment program satisfactory to the board, including participation in individual or group therapy on at least a weekly basis; to participate in AA or NA meetings at least once per week; to submit to drug and alcohol screens on a twice-weekly basis; to be responsible for submission of quarterly practice and therapy reports.

On July 19, 2000, the board considered Dr. Darcy's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license. The board also considered Dr. Darcy's notification to the board that his professional mentor, Dr. Mantei, was leaving in August or September, and that Dr. Darcy was in the process of acquiring a new mentor. The board ordered a stay of the suspension of the license for an additional period of three months, contingent upon his timely acquisition of a new professional mentor.

On October 18, 2000, and January 17, 2001, the board granted Dr. Darcy's requests for further three month stays of the suspension of his license.

On April 18, 2001, the board approved Dr. Darcy's request for a further stay of the suspension.

Dr. Darcy appeared before the board on May 16, 2001, for his annual appearance. Based upon that appearance, and other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the board's Final Decision and Order in this matter dated January 20, 1999, is hereby modified to decrease the number of required urine screens from two per week to one per week.
