ORDER GRANTING STAY

AND DENYING REQUEST

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On January 29, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that she participate in psychotherapy a minimum once each week, that she participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once each week, and that she participate in AA/NA meetings at least once each week.

By letter dated August 31, 1999, respondent requested that her limited license be renewed and requested as well that the frequency of required therapy, urine screens and AA/NA sessions each be reduced to twice a month. By its Order dated September 23, 1999, the board granted the request for an extension of the stay, but denied the request for reduction in the number of required urine screens AA/NA sessions be reduced.

By letter dated November 29, 1999, Ms. McLean requested a further three month stay, and again requested that required urine screens be reduced. She also requested that the number of required therapy sessions be reduced to two per month. The requests were supported by her probation officer and her therapist, respectively, and the board reduced both the number of required therapy sessions and urine screens to twice per month.

On May 19, 2000, the board considered Ms. McLean's requests for a further three month stay of the suspension, and her further request that the requirement that she attend therapy be dropped. The board granted the stay but denied the request that the requirement for therapy be dropped.

By letter dated August 30, 2000, , Ms. McLean requested a further three month stay of the suspension, and further requested that the board's Order be modified to terminate the therapy requirement. The board granted the stay, but again denied the request that the requirement for therapy be dropped.

On January 5, 2001, the board considered Ms. McLean's request that all limitations on her license be dropped. Based upon all information of record herein, including the fact that Ms. McLean has not yet been subject to the board's Order for the requisite minimum period of two years, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request of Susan M. McLean, RN, that all limitations on her license be terminated is denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the suspension of Ms. McLean's license is stayed for a further period of three months.
