TERESA M. KLUECK, LPN,	AMENDED ORDER
Respondent	GRANTING STAY

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On March 5, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than two years, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that she participate in psychotherapy a once weekly, and that she participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once per week.

On March 3, 2000, the board considered Ms. Klueck's request for a three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board granted the request.

On May 19, 2000, the board considered Ms. Klueck's petition for a change in the conditions on her license to reduce the number of required urine screens and the number of required therapy sessions from one per week to one every two weeks. The board granted the request by its order dated June 6, 2000.

On November 3, 2000, the board considered Ms. Klueck's request for an additional three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board also considered evidence of her having violated the Order by failing to submit to the minimum number of required screens, and failing to notify the board of the change in her employment status within the required five days. Accordingly, the board denied the request for a further stay.

On January 5, 2001, Ms. Klueck appeared before the board in support of her request for a further three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board granted the stay by its Order dated January 12, 2001.

By letter dated March 5, 2001, Ms. Klueck requested that all limitations on her license be terminated. The board considered the request on April 6, 2001, denied the request for a full license, but granted the three month stay. By error, the Order granting the stay indicated that she was granted full licensure. Accordingly, the April 12, 2001, Order is hereby amended to read as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Teresa M. Klueck is hereby stayed for a further period of three months, effective April 6, 2001.
