ORDER GRANTING

Respondent

TWO MONTH STAY

On May 14, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for period of not less than two years, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that she participate in psychotherapy a minimum of once each week, and that she participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once per week.

By letter dated November 25, 2000, respondent requested that the suspension of her limited license be stayed for a further period of three months, and requested as well that the frequency of required therapy be reduced. The board granted the request by its Order dated January 12, 2001.

On April 6, 2001, the board considered Ms. Stock's request for a further three month stay or, in the alternative, that all limitations on her license be dropped, and Ms. Stock appeared in support of her request. The board denied full licensure, granted a three month stay, and modified the order to permit Ms. Stock access to controlled substances in her employment setting.

On June 1, 2001, the board granted Ms. Stock's request for a further three month stay of the suspension.

On September 6, 2001, the board considered Ms. Stock's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board also considered evidence that a urine screen on August 20, 2001, was positive for propoxephene. Ms. Stock denies that this is possible and the sample was at the time of the board's meeting being retested. Accordingly, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Sandra Jovre Stock, R.N., is hereby stayed for a further period of two months. The board will consider the matter further when the final results of the August 20, 2001 screen are known.
