On September 17, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was

suspended for an indefinite period, with provision for grant of successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent's application for a stay be accompanied by a current evaluation of her condition and proof of her enrollment in a drug treatment program. Upon grant of the stay, Ms. Amick was required, among other conditions, to participate in psychotherapy a minimum of four times each month, and participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than four times per month.

On April 6, 2001, Ms Amick appeared before the board in support of her petition for a stay of the suspension of her license, and the board considered the matter on that date. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

### **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Lisa Marie Amick, R.N., is hereby stayed for a period of three months. Ms. Amick may petition for further three month stays of the suspension, which petitions shall be granted upon satisfactory demonstration that she has fully complied with the terms and conditions of the board's September 17, 1999, Final Decision and Order during the preceding three month period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Final decision and Order in this matter is hereby modified to permit Ms. Amick to have access to and administer controlled substances in her employment setting.
