ORDER ADOPTING STIPULATION

On or about July 20, 2001, Frank V. Sacco, RN, filed his application for a license to practice as a registered nurse by examination. Mr. Sacco's application indicates that he has a criminal conviction record, and he was therefore invited to make an appearance before the board in connection with his application. Mr. Sacco appeared on December 6, 2001.

The board and Mr. Sacco thereafter entered into a Stipulation, by which the board agreed to grant, and Mr. Sacco agreed to accept, a limited license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin. Based upon the Stipulation, and upon all other information of record herein, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Frank V. Sacco, RN, is hereby granted a limited license to practice as a professional nurse in Wisconsin, imposing the following terms and conditions:

1. The effective date of the limited license shall be the date that Mr. Sacco is notified that he has passed the National Council Licensing Examination for registered nurses.
2. During the term of the limited license, Mr. Sacco shall be responsible for submission to the board of quarterly written reports prepared by Mr. Sacco's employment supervisor, setting forth Mr. Sacco's activities and progress in his employment.
3. Within 60 days from the effective date of the limited license, Mr. Sacco shall submit to the board documentation of an evaluation of his psychological status performed by a health care provider acceptable to the board. The evaluation shall include a diagnosis of Mr. Sacco's current psychological status, and any recommendations for ongoing therapy. Should therapy be recommended, then therapy sessions shall be conducted on a schedule established by Mr. Sacco's health care provider, but not less than twice per month.
4. Mr. Sacco may petition the board for termination of any of the limitations on his license after a period of two years. Denial of any such petition shall not constitute denial of a license or give rise to the right to a contested case hearing under § 227.01(3) or 227.42, Stats.
