The State of Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, having considered the record in the above captioned matter, makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On July 17, 2001, the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing (department) issued an Order Adopting Stipulation granting a limited private security permit registration to Robert A. Pulver. Among other things, the Order Adopting Stipulation limits the registration of Robert A. Pulver by requiring that Robert A. Pulver file quarterly reports with the Department providing information concerning his employment, arrest and conviction record and job performance. Paragraph 2. of the Order Adopting Stipulation requires that quarterly reports be filed within 5 days after the following dates: November 1, 2001, February 1, 2002, May 1, 2002 and August 1, 2002. A copy of the Order Adopting Stipulation is annexed hereto.
- 2. The Order Adopting Stipulation (Paragraph 4) also states that Applicant Pulver may not transfer to another licensed private detective agency and perform activities under his private security permit without permission, in advance, from the Department of Regulation and Licensing, and unless the new employer agrees, in writing, that the terms of this limitation will be complied with and that the new employer will cooperate with the applicant in the preparation and submittal to the department of the required reports.
- 3. The Order Adopting Stipulation further provides that the failure of Robert A. Pulver to comply with the limitation in the Order Adopting Stipulation shall result in the revocation of his limited private security permit without further notice or hearing or other proceedings.
- 4. Marlene Meyer is an employee of the Department whose job title is "Department Monitor" and whose responsibilities include receiving and monitoring reports from credential holders who hold a limited credential and who are required to file reports with the Department.
- 5. On or about March 29, 2002, Marlene Meyer wrote to Robert A. Pulver, stating in part that: "To date, you have failed to have the following filed with the Division of Enforcement in your behalf:

The quarterly report from your employer, Martin Security Inc.

Please submit the requested reports by April 9, 2002. Failure to return the reports will cause this matter to be referred to Division of Enforcement as a possible violation of the Board order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The State of Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing has jurisdiction in this proceeding under Chapter 440, Stats., and the provisions in the Order Adopting Stipulation.
- 2. The State of Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing has authority to issue the following Order under Chapter 440, Stats., and the provisions in the Order Adopting Stipulation.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Limited Private Security Permit of Robert A. Pulver (license #18193) is REVOKED. Applicant Robert A. Pulver shall cease and desist from acting as a private security person and from engaging in private security activities in Wisconsin.

It Is Further Ordered That Applicant shall have an opportunity to challenge the accuracy of the information contained in the FINDINGS OF FACT, above by submitting information to the Administrator, Division of Business Licensure and Regulation, P.O. Box 8935, Madison WI 53708-8935 within 10 days after the date of signing, below.

It Is Further Ordered That Revocation of the Applicant's conditional private security permit shall become effective on the tenth day after the date of signing, below.

It Is Further Ordered That Applicant shall immediately return the wallet size conditional private security permit and the $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 5 \frac{1}{4}$ wall certificate to the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Attention: Jan Bobholz, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935.
