The Executive Committee having received the results of the investigation into the alleged misconduct of Todd Didier and in conformity with its rules now makes the following:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The respondent acquired his first Wisconsin Counselor Certification Development Plan on 7/10/1998 and became a Registered Alcohol/Drug Counselor I (RADCI) on 8/4/1998.
2. The respondent's RADCI is paid through July 10, 2002.
3. In April and October, 2001, the respondent's former employer received allegations from two separate male clients. The nearly verbatim allegations from these two clients alleged that during their counseling sessions the respondent made remarks of a sexual nature not related to the clients' therapy.
4. The respondent's employer suspended and reinstated the respondent in April, 2001 at the time of the 1<sup>st</sup> allegation. On October 19, 2001 after the 2<sup>nd</sup> similar allegation, the respondent was terminated from his employer, Columbia - St. Mary's Hospital of Ozaukee.

**CONCLUSION**

On more than one occasion, the respondent engaged in conduct which does not meet the generally accepted standards of practice. Therefore, the Executive Committee concludes that the respondent, Todd Didier, breached the following Rule contained within the *Counselor Code of Conduct* (1996):


Rule 2.2 - A counselor shall not engage in conduct which does not meet the generally accepted standards of practice.

**DECISION**

Pursuant to Section V(A)(3) of the WCB *Counselor Code of Conduct* (Rev. 1996), Action by the Executive Committee, Todd Didier's registration as an alcohol/drug counselor I is hereby Revoked.
