ORDER SUSPENDING THE LICENSE
By its Final Decision and Order dated March 4, 1994, the Board of Nursing suspended Ms. Pitzer's license indefinitely. The board's Order provided for consecutive three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon applicant's compliance with limitations placed on her license, including for participation in a drug treatment program. Because applicant failed to so participate, the suspension went into effect, and her license has been suspended since that time.
On January 29, 1999, Ms. Pitzer appeared before the board in support of her petition to reinstate her license, and the board considered the request on that date. The board granted a three month stay and limited the license to require that she complete a nurse refresher course and to thereafter participa in a drug or alcohol treatment program.
On August 14, 2001, and again on November 1, 2001, the board granted Ms. Pitzer's requests for three month stays.
On February 1, 2002, the board granted Ms. Pitzer's request for a further three month stay, but denied her further request for a reduction in the number or required urine screens.
On May 2, 2002, the board considered Ms. Pitzer's request for a further three month stay, and the renewal of her request for a reduction in the number of required urine screens. The board again granted the stay but denied the request for a reduction in screens.
On August 9, 2002, the board granted Ms. Pitzer's request for a further three month stay of the suspension.
On November 7, 2002, the board considered Ms. Pitzer's request for a further three month stay. The board also considered evidence that at the time of the meeting all required quarterly reports had not bee received, and Ms. Pitzer had not requested a further stay. Accordingly, the board granted a stay fo one month.
On December 5, 2002, the board considered evidence that Ms. Pitzer was still not in compliance with the board's Order. Consequently, the board orders as follows:
<u>ORDER</u>
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the stay of the suspension of the license of Rita V. Pitzer, RN, is terminated, and Ms. Pitzer's license is hereby suspended.
