ORDER GRANTING STAY

On April 5, 2000, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended, with provision for three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with limitations requiring, among other conditions, that Dr. McDaniel continue successful participation in a drug and alcohol treatment program, and that he abstain from the use of unprescribed controlled substances and alcohol.

On May 17, 2000, the board considered evidence that Dr. McDaniel had relapsed and was currently in active inpatient treatment. Accordingly, and based upon probable cause to believe that Dr. McDaniel had violated the board's April 5, 2000, Final decision and Order, the board lifted the stay of suspension and suspended the license.

On June 22, 2000, Dr. McDaniel appeared before the board along with Attorney Hal Harlowe in support of his petition for a further stay of the suspension of his license. The board granted the stay by its Order dated June 22, 2000.

On September 20, 2000, the board granted Dr. McDaniel's request for a further three month stay.

On December 20, 2000, the board considered Dr. McDaniel's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license. The board also considered that not all of the required reports had been received. Accordingly, the board granted a one month stay until the board's Meeting of January 17, 2001.

On January 17, 2001, and April 8, 2001, the board granted Dr. McDaniel's requests for further stays.

On July 18, 2001, Dr. McDaniel appeared with Attorney Hal Harlow in support of various requests, as set forth in Dr. McDaniel's letter of May 24, 2001. These included a request for return to full licensure or, in the alternative, a modification to the terms and conditions of the limited license to grant reinstatement of his DEA registration, reduction in required urine screens to one per week, and reduction of therapy to one every other week. The board reduced the number of required urine screens and therapy sessions to two per month.

On October 17, 2001, and January 23, 2002, the board granted Dr. McDaniel's requests for further stays.

On March 20, 2002, the board considered Dr. McDaniel's request that, in consideration of his illness and his current inability to actively practice medicine and surgery, the affirmative requirements imposed by the board's order, including urine screens and participation in other aspects of his treatment program, be suspended until he is able to resume the practice of medicine. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of Dr. McDaniel's license to practice medicine and surgery is hereby stayed for a further period of three months.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that for the period of the stay or until he resumes practice, whichever is sooner, Dr. McDaniel is relieved from the requirements established by the board's Final decision and Order dated April 5, 2000.
