ORDER GRANTING STAY

On March 22, 2001, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than five years, with provision for consecutive three month stays of the suspension contingent upon compliance with a number of conditions and limitations on the license. Among other conditions, Dr. Park was required to enroll and successfully participate in a drug and alcohol treatment program satisfactory to the board, including participation in individual or group therapy on at least a weekly basis; to participate in AA or NA meetings at least once per week; to submit to drug and alcohol screens on a twice-weekly basis; to be responsible for submission of quarterly practice and therapy reports.

Dr. Park appeared before the board on October 17, 2001, in support of his request for a three month stay of the suspension of his license, and for approval of his professional mentor and his supervising health care provider. The board approved those requests by its Order dated October 23, 2001.

On December 19, 2001, the board considered Dr. Park's request that his drug screens be handled through the diversion program administered by the Medical Board of the State of California rather than by the screening program administered by the Department of Regulation & Licensing.

Based upon Dr. Park's requests, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Dr. Park's drug screens required by the board's Order dated March 22, 2001, shall be handled through the diversion program administered by the Medical Board of the State of California rather than by the screening program administered by the Department of Regulation & Licensing.
