The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Psychology Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Itzhak Matusiak, Ph.D., Respondent, date of birth March 25, 1944, is licensed by the Wisconsin Psychology Examining Board as a psychologist in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 650, which was first granted November 17, 1977.
- 2. Respondent's last address reported to the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 7670 N. Port Washington Road, Suite 103, Milwaukee, WI 53217.
- 3. This matter was scheduled for hearing on February 26 and 27, 2002. Testimony was taken and evidence admitted during the morning of February 26. At that point, the attorney for the

Complainant moved for the dismissal of this action with prejudice. Attorney for the Complainant stated that based upon the evidence which had been admitted, and the evidence which he anticipated being admitted if the hearing continued, he did not believe that Complainant could prove by a preponderance of the evidence that Respondent had violated the rules of the Board as alleged in the complaint in this matter.

4. The parties have agreed that this matter be dismissed with prejudice.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Psychology Examining Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to § 455.09, Stats.
- 2. The Wisconsin Psychology Examining Board has authority to enter into this stipulated resolution of this matter pursuant to § 227.44(5), Stats.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. That this disciplinary proceeding against the Respondent, Itzhak Matusiak, Ph.D., is hereby DISMISSED, with prejudice.
