ORDER GRANTING STAY

On September 25, 1997, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, Mr. Leroux's license was suspended for an indefinite period. Mr. Leroux was permitted to petition for an initial three month stay of suspension upon submission to the board of a psychological evaluation concluding that Mr. Leroux is fit to safely and competently return to the practice of nursing.

On July 11, 2002, the board considered Mr. Leroux's petition for a stay of the suspension, along with an assessment submitted by Frank Coogan, CICSW, MSW, of American Behavioral Clinics. Based upon that assessment, and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Mark J. Leroux to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin be, and hereby is, stayed for a period of three months. Mr. Leroux may petition for further three month stays, which shall be granted upon submission of satisfactory evidence that he has fully complied with all terms and conditions of the board's June 6, 2002, Final Decision and Order.
