1 Pablo Pedraza M.D. was born o	n March 11, 1941, and is licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license
	t 19, 1970. Dr. Pedraza specializes in cardiovascular surgery.
2. On January 11, 2000, a 67 year	old woman presented at St. Mary's Hospital in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for implantation of a cardiac pacemaker.
3. During the surgery, Respondent i	inadvertently pierced the patient's aorta and her left lung.
4. The patient began to demonstrat	e unusual distress, but Respondent did not immediately recognize his error.
5. The patient went into cardiac and called to the incident by Responden	d pulmonary arrest, and, despite the efforts of Respondent, the attending cardiologist, and additional medical staff it, she died.
6. On autopsy, the cause of death w	vas determined to be perforation of the aorta during pacemaker placement.
	Conclusions of Law
1. The Medical Examining Board ha	s jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to s. 448.02(3), Stats.
2. Respondent's conduct described	above constitutes a violation of s. MED 10.02(22)(h), Wis. Admin. Code.

Now, therefore, the Board accepts t	he stipulation of the parties.
It is further ordered that Pablo Pedr	aza, M.D., is reprimanded.
