STATE OF WISCONSIN

Respondent has also been licensed in Arizona since 1987.

Respondent Daniel S. Boswein (dob 5/1/52) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth

FINDINGS OF FACT

herein a chiropractor licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license #3639, first granted on 1/10/00.

2. Respondent was, on 6/27/99, arrested for unlawfully possessing cocaine for personal nonmedical use

by Phoenix, AZ, police. At the time, respondent admitted to the arresting officer that he engaged in cocaine use as often as once or twice a week. Respondent was permitted by the Maricopa County Attorney to participate in diversion program of treatment. As a result of these facts, respondent's initial Wisconsin license was limited and he was required to engage in a drug treatment program, by Order of the Board dated 1/25/00.
3. Respondent was, on 5/3/01, detained by West Allis police during their execution of a search warran upon a house commonly used for drug transactions. Respondent admitted to West Allis police that he had unlawfully purchased and used cocaine several times over the previous 24 hours, and that he was present at the house for the express purpose of buying more cocaine.
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
A. The Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §446.03), Wis. Stats. and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.
B. The conduct described in paragraph 3, above, is grounds for discipline under §446.03(2), Wis. Stats. Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.
<u>ORDER</u>
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation is accepted.
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the SURRENDER of the license to practice chiropractic of Daniel S. Boswein, DC, is ACCEPTED. Dr. Boswein shall not do any act constituting the practice of chiropractic in Wisconsin, without being licensed.
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that costs are waived in consideration of the surrender of the license, but if respondent ever seeks reinstatement, he shall pay the costs of this matter in the amount of \$950 as a condition of any reinstatement or relicensure.
