On February 22, 1996, the board entered its Final Decision and Order in the Matter of Disciplinary Proceedings Against Louis S. Seno Jr., M.D. By the terms of the board's Order, Dr. Seno's license was limited to require in part that he complete a medical record-keeping course, that he recertify with the American Board of Family Practice within one year of the Order, and that he surrender his DEA registration for Schedules I and II Controlled Substances.

As of January 22, 1998, all limitations on Dr. Seno's license had been satisfied except the condition that he refrain from applying for or holding a DEA registration for Schedule I and II Controlled Substances, and Dr. Seno appeared before the board on that date and requested that the board remove the limitation on his license relating to Schedule I and II Controlled substances. the board issued its "Order Restoring Full Licensure" on February 10, 1998, but reached a Stipulation with Dr. Seno by which he voluntarily agreed not to prescribe or dispense Schedule II Controlled Substances except in limited circumstances.

The board's Order specifically stated that the Order was not to be deemed a disciplinary order, but there appears to be some confusion in that regard. Accordingly, Dr. Seno appeared before the board on June 19, 2002, and requested that he be relieved from the voluntary agreement to abstain from prescribing and dispensing Schedule II Controlled Substances...

Based upon Dr. Seno's request, and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

### <u>ORDER</u>

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Dr. Seno's request that he be relieved from his voluntary agreement to abstain from prescribing and dispensing Schedule II Controlled Substances is granted, and there are therefore no limitations f any kind on Dr. Seno's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin.
