	ORDER GRANTING FULL LICENSURE

On February 10, 1998, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of three years. The Order provided that Ms. Danaher-Dunn could petition for stay of the suspension of the license after one year upon submission to the board of evidence that she is able to safely and competently return to the active practice of nursing. The Order further provided that upon such a showing, the board could grant a three month stay of the suspension, with provision for further extensions of the stay conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license.

By letter dated September 25, 2000, Ms. Danaher-Dunn requested that she be permitted to appear before the board in support of her request for a stay of the suspension of her license. She appeared before the board on November 3, 2000, and the board granted the stay on that date.

On and after March 1, 2001, the board granted Ms. Danaher-Dunn's requests for further stays of the suspension of her license.

On September 5, 2002, Danaher-Dunn appeared before the board in support of her request that all limitations on her license be terminated, and the board considered the matter on that date. Based upon her request and other information of record, it is ordered as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that all limitations on the license of Patricia Danaher-Dunn to practice as a professional nur	rse in
Wisconsin are terminated, and Ms. Danaher-Dunn is hereby reinstated to full licensure.
