ORDER REINSTATING FULL LICENSURE

On June 25, 1997, the Medical Examining Board issued its *Final Decision and Order Based Upon Settlement Conference* in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, Dr. Flynn's license to practice podiatry in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than five years, with provision for successive three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance by Dr. Flynn with limitations on his license during the preceding three months. Dr. Flynn was to participate in a drug and alcohol treatment program, participate in individual and/or group therapy and alcoholics Anonymous, and submit to drug and alcohol screens on a weekly basis.

By letter dated July 30, 1998, Dr. Flynn requested a further three month stay of the suspension of his license, and requested as well that the number of required urine screens be reduced. The board granted the requests by its Order dated September 4, 1998.

On November 19, 1998, the board granted Dr. Flynn's request for a further stay of the suspension of his license.

On March 22, 1999, the board considered Dr. Flynn's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license, and his further request that the number of required urine screens be reduced from two to one per month. The board granted the stay but denied the request for a reduction in urine screens by its Order dated March 23, 1999.

On July 20, 1999, the board considered Dr. Flynn's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license. The board also considered a recommendation by Dr. Flynn's supervising physician, Dr. Charles Engel, that Dr. Flynn be reinstated to full licensure. The board granted the stay but denied the request for a full license.

On April 10, 2000, the board granted Dr. Flynn's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license.

Dr. Flynn appeared before the board on July 10, 2000, and again requested that he be reinstated to full licensure. The board granted the stay on that date, but denied the petition for a full license.

On January 8, 2001, the board considered Dr. Flynn's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. Because Dr. Flynn's therapy report had not been received, the board ordered that the stay would be granted conditioned upon receipt of the missing report within seven days. Based upon the subsequent receipt of the report, the board granted the stay.

On August 6, 2001, November 12, 2001, and again on April 8, 2002, the board granted Dr. Flynn's requests for further three month stays of the suspension.

On August 12, 2002, the board considered Dr. Flynn's request for termination of all limitations on his license. Based upon all information of record herein, including Dr. Flynn's full compliance with the terms of his limited license for a period of five years, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that all limitations on the license of Dion Patrick Flynn, DPM, to practice podiatric medicine in the State of Wisconsin are terminated, and Dr. Flynn is hereby reinstated to full licensure.
