ORDER GRANTING STAY

On October 22, 1997, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than five years, with provision for consecutive three month stays of the suspension contingent upon compliance with a number of conditions and limitations on the license. Among other conditions, Dr. Goy was required to enroll and successfully participate in a drug and alcohol treatment program satisfactory to the board, including participation in individual or group therapy on at least a weekly basis; to participate in AA or NA meetings at least once per week; to submit to drug and alcohol screens on a twice-weekly basis; to be responsible for submission of quarterly practice and therapy reports; and to participate in continuing education in prescribing controlled substances and in record-keeping.

Pursuant to the board's Order, Dr. Goy appeared before the board at its meeting of January 22, 1998, in support of his request for a further three month stay of the suspension. The board considered the request on that date, and granted the stay. Further stays were granted on May 6, 1998, and August 3, 1998.

By letter dated August 14, 1998, Dr. Goy requested a further extension of the stay of suspension, and requested as well that the number of required urine screens be reduced to one per week, and that the requirement that he practice only under the supervision of a mentor be dropped. Those requests were supported by Dr. Benzer. The board considered the requests at its meeting of October 21, 1998, and granted the requests by its Order dated November 4, 1998.

The board considered Dr. Goy's requests for further stays at its meetings of January 20 April 21, 1999, and July 22, 1999, and granted the requests by its Orders dated January 27, May 1, and July 27, 1999.

At its meeting of October 20, 1999, the board considered Dr. Goy's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license, and his further requests that the number of required urine screens be reduced to two per month, and that weekly group therapy sessions be discontinued. The board granted those requests.

On January 19, 2000, April 19, 2000, and July 19, 2000, the board considered Dr. Goy's requests for further stays of the suspension of his license. The board granted the requests.

On October 18, 2000, the board considered Dr. Goy's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, and his further request that the number of required urine screens be reduced to one per month. The board granted the requests by its Order dated October 25, 2000.

On January 17, 2001, April 18, 2001, and July 18, 2001, the board granted Dr. Goy's requests for further three month stays of the suspension of his license.

On October 17, 2001, the board considered Dr. Goy's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license, and his further request that the board consider terminating the limitations on his license. The board granted the stay, but denied the full license.

On January 23, 2002, and April 24, 2002, the board granted Dr. Goy's requests for further three month stays of the suspension of his license.

On July 24, 2002, the board considered Dr. Goy's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. Based upon Dr. Goy's request, and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the stay of the suspension of the license of Peter W. Goy, M.D., is extended for an additional period of three months.
