ORDER MODIFYING

THE LIMITED LICENSE

On February 4, 1998, the Veterinary Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice veterinary medicine in Wisconsin was limited to require, among other conditions, that Dr. Rogers restrict his prescription and dispensing of controlled substances to Phenobarbital injectable 100 cc, 65 mg/cc; Phenobarb tabs 1/4 grain; Cheque Drops 55 cc, 100 mg/cc; Socumb Solution 250 cc, 1 gr/cc; Torbutrol 1 mg tabs; and Torbugesic 10 ml injectable.

By letter dated May 19, 1998, Dr. Stevens notified the board that in identifying controlled substances essential to his practice at the time of the stipulation in this matter, his identification of Phenobarbital injectable was in error, and that he had intended to identify Pentobarbital injectable. Dr. Stevens therefore requested that the board modify the board's Order accordingly. The board considered the request at its meeting of June 17, 1998, and granted the request by its Order dated June 17, 1998.

On May 15, 2002, the board considered Dr. Rogers' request that Ketamine be added as a controlled substance that he is permitted to prescribe and dispense. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that paragraph # 1.a. of the board's Order set forth in the final Decision and Order in this matter dated February 4, 1998, is hereby modified to read as follows:

a. Respondent shall restrict his prescription and dispensing of controlled substances to the use of the following drugs only:

Pentobarbital injectable 100 cc, 65 mg/cc

Phenobarb tabs 1/4 grain

Cheque Drops 55 cc, 100 mg/cc

Socumb Solution 250 cc, 1 gr/cc

Torbutrol 1 mg tabs

Torbugesic 10 ml injectable

Ketamine
