ORDER GRANTING STAY

Respondent

By its Order dated September 17, 1998, the Board of Nursing revoked the license of June E. Hamilton, R.N., to practice as a professional nurse in Wisconsin. By letter dated November 27, 2000, Ms. Hamilton requested reinstatement of her license, and she appeared before the board on March 1, 2001, in support of her request. The board and Ms. Hamilton thereafter entered into a Stipulation, by which the Board of Nursing (board) agreed to grant and Ms. Hamilton (respondent) agreed to accept, a limited license to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin. Based upon that Stipulation, the board granted a limited license to practice professional nursing in Wisconsin imposing a number of terms and conditions.

Among these are that Respondent shall maintain successful participation in all components of a program for the treatment of chemical dependency at a treatment facility acceptable to the board. In addition, respondent must attend Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous or another self-help group acceptable to the board at least one time per week. Finally, Respondent must participate in a program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her urine, blood and/or hair on a frequency of not less than four screens per month.

On January 4, 2002, the board granted Ms. Hamilton's petition for a further three month stay of the suspension of her license.

On April 4, 2002, the board considered Ms. Hamilton's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, and that the number of required therapy sessions and urine screens be reduced. Based upon those requests, and other information of record herein, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of June E. Hamilton, RN, is hereby stayed for a further period of three months. Ms. Hamilton may petition for additional stays of the suspension, which shall be granted upon submission of satisfactory evidence that Ms. Hamilton has complied with all limitations on her license during the preceding three month period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the number of required therapy sessions is hereby reduced to two per quarter, and that the number of required urine screens is hereby reduced to eight per quarter.
