ORDER GRANTING STAY	
On March 3, 2001, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that he participate in psychotherapy a minimum of once each week, that he attend AA or NA meetings each week, and that he participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in his blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once each week.	
By letter dated March 9, 2001, respondent requested that the terms of his limited license be modified to reduce the number of required therapy sessions to once every three weeks, and to permit him to make up the missing therapy sessions with extra Alcoholic Anonymous meetings.	
On May 3, 2001, the board considered Mr. Gabor's request, and considered as well information that Mr. Gabor had failed to submit evidence of his full compliance with the terms and conditions imposed by the board's Order. Accordingly, the board denied the stay.	
On August 9, 2003, the board considered Mr. Gabor's request for reinstatement of the manner in which urine screens were reported, the stay was denied.	f the stay of suspension. Based upon irregularities in
