By its Final Decision and Order dated August 6, 2001, the Podiatrists Affiliated Credentialing Board limited Dr. Labadie's license to require that he comply in all respects with the integrity requirements contained in the settlement agreement entered into by Dr. Labadie and the United States of America dated December 27, 1999. Further, Dr. Labadie is required to cause copies of all reports and audits required by the settlement agreement to be simultaneously filed with the Department Monitor. The Order provided that after five years of continuous active professional practice under the terms of the Order and upon evidence of continuous compliance with the terms and conditions of the settlement agreement, Dr. Labadie may petition the Board for a termination of all limitations on his license and restoration of an unlimited license.

On November 10, 2003, the board considered Dr. Labadie's request that all limitations on his license be terminated in order that his license no longer carry the notation that it is limited. The board notes that Dr. Labadie has completed only the first of the three annual audits required by the federal settlement agreement, and notes as well that the board's Order does nothing more than require that he comply with the federal order. Accordingly, the "limited" notation on his license imposes no requirement that does not otherwise exist. Accordingly, it is ordered as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the petition of Dr. Labadie that the board terminate all limitations on his license be, and hereby is, denied.
