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ORDER GRANTING STAY

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On October 4, 2001, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period. The Order provided that respondent could petition for a three month stay of the suspension at any time, with provision for additional stays conditioned upon respondent's compliance with certain conditions and limitations on her license. Included among these were that respondent participate in an approved drug and alcohol treatment program, that she participate in therapy at least once per week, and that she attend AA or NA on at least a weekly basis. Respondent was also required to participate in a drug screening program consisting of at least one screen per week.

Also on October 4, 2001, the board considered Ms. Anglehart's request for an immediate three month stay of the suspension, and the board granted the stay by its Order dated October 29, 2001. Further stays were granted by the board on January 4, 2002, April 4, 2002 July 22, 2002, and October 15, 2002..

On January 10, 2003, the board considered Ms. Anglehart's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. Based upon that request, and upon other evidence in this matter, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Kathleen Ann Anglehart, RN, is hereby stayed for a further period of three months. Ms. Anglehart may petition for further stays, and such petitions shall be granted upon submission of satisfactory evidence that Ms. Anglehart has fully complied with the board's October 4, 2001, Order during the preceding three month period
