DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS AGAINST : ORDER GRANTING STAY  
: AND MODIFYING CONDITIONS  
JEFFREY T. JUNIG, M.D. :  
RESPONDENT. :

- Respondent is required to enroll and continue successful participation in all components of a drug and alcohol treatment program at a treatment facility acceptable to the Board as respondent's Supervising Health Care Provider shall determine to be appropriate for respondent's rehabilitation.
- The rehabilitation program shall include and respondent shall participate in individual and/or group therapy sessions for the first year of the stayed suspension upon a schedule as recommended by the supervising physician or therapist, but not less than once weekly. Such therapy shall be conducted by the supervising physician or therapist, or another qualified physician or therapist as designated by the supervising physician or therapist and acceptable to the Board, and shall include appropriate components addressing all diagnoses identified in the discharge summary referred to in the Findings of Fact.
- Respondent is required to attend Narcotics Anonymous and/or Alcoholic Anonymous meetings or an equivalent program for recovering professionals, upon a frequency as recommended by the supervising physician or therapist, but not less than one meeting per week
- Respondent is required to abstain from all personal use of controlled substances as defined in §961.01(4), Stats., except when necessitated by a legitimate medical condition and then only with the prior approval of the Supervising Health Care Provider, and is required to abstain from all personal use of alcohol.
- Within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order, respondent is required to enroll and begin participation in a drug and alcohol monitoring program which is approved by the department and which shall require the testing of urine specimens at a frequency of not less than 104 times per year.
- Respondent shall not prescribe, dispense, administer or order any controlled substances, and shall surrender any DEA registration to prescribe, dispense, administer and order controlled substances to the Drug

- Respondent shall practice only under the supervision of a designated Professional Mentor approved by the Board or in a work setting pre-approved by the Board or its designated agent, and shall arrange for his Professional Mentor to provide formal written reports to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

Also on September 25, 2002, the board granted Dr. Junig's request for an initial three month stay of the suspension of his license.

On December 18, 2002, and March 19, 2003, the board granted Dr. Junig's requests for further three month stays of the suspension.

On June 18, 2003, the board granted Dr. Junig's requests for a further three month stay of the suspension, and his further requests for a change in mentor and a decrease in the number of counseling sessions. The board denied the requests for a reduction in the number of required urine screens and to permit him to hold a DEA registration.

On September 24, 2003, the board considered Dr. Junig's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, and renewal of his requests for a decrease in the number of required urine screens and to permit him to hold a DEA registration. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Jeffrey T. Junig, MD, PhD, is hereby stayed for a period of three months.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the number of required urine screens is hereby reduced to one per week.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Dr. Jung's request that he be allowed to apply for and hold a DEA registration is hereby granted.
