FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On July 1, 1997, the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing granted Matthew J. Morstatter a Private Security Person Permit (#326). Mr. Morstatter's last known address is 2923 Green Bay Street, La Crosse, WI 54601. The Department has learned that Mr. Morstatter is presently incarcerated at the Fox Lake Correctional Institution, Post Office Box 147, Fox Lake, WI 53933. The Permit expired on September 1, 2002. Mr. Morstatter has the right to renew this permit upon payment of a late fee and the renewal credential fee pursuant to Sec. 440.08(3), Wis. Stats. Mr. Morstatter has not as of this date submitted any renewal fees and late fees for his Private Security Person Permit.
- 2. On January 23, 2001, Mr. Morstatter was convicted in Milwaukee County Circuit Court of one (1) charge of Felony Theft of Movable Property, more than \$2,500.00. A certified copy of the Criminal Complaint and Judgment of Conviction is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.
