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Finally, Ms. Laluzerne was required to arrange for her employer to provide formal written reports to the board on a

quarterly basis, assessing Ms. Laluzerne’s work performance.

Also on January 10, 2003, the board considered Ms. Laluzerne’s petition for a three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board considered as well that there was no evidence that Ms. Laluzerne had complied with the board’s Order for the previous three months. Accordingly, the board denied the stay.

On February 7, 2003, the board considered evidence that Ms. Laluzerne was now in compliance with the terms of her limited license. Accordingly, the board granted the stay.

On April 16 and August 8, 2003, the board granted Ms. Laluzerne's requests for further stays of the suspension.

On November 7, 2003, the board considered Ms. Laluzerne’s requests for a further stay of the suspension, and her further request for a reduction in the number of required urine screens. The board notes that Ms. Laluzerne has practiced under the ordered limitations for less than one year. Accordingly, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for a stay of the suspension of the license of Ellen N. Laluzerne, RN, to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin is granted, and the suspension is hereby stayed for a period of three months.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Ms. Laluzerne’s request for a reduction in the number of required urine screens is denied.
