The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

For the purpose of settlement of this matter, Ms. Zarzana neither admits nor denies the allegations against her. Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Angelina Zarzana, LPN (DOB 02/01/1949) is duly licensed as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin (license #16239). This license was first granted on 05/28/1975.

- 2. Ms. Zarzana's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 408 Pheasant Lane, Sullivan, Wisconsin, 53178.
- 3. At all times relevant to this action, Ms. Zarzana was working as a licensed practical nurse at SouthPointe Healthcare Center, 4500 Loomis Road, Greenfield, Wisconsin.
 - 4. The Division of Enforcement has evidence sufficient to establish probable cause that at least:
 - a. On or about January 7, 2002 Respondent entered a fabricated blood sugar reading for resident JN of 96 at 1600 hours;
 - b. On or about January 18, 2002 Respondent entered a fabricated blood sugar reading for resident JN of 112 at 1600 hours; and
 - c. On or about January 18, 2002 Respondent entered a fabricated blood sugar reading for resident JD of 252 at 1600 hours.
- 5. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to issuance of the following Conclusion of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By the conduct described above Respondent violated 441.07(1), Wis. Stats. and Wis. Admin. Code §§ N 7.03(1 (a) and N 7.04(4), (6) and (15).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that

- 1. Angelina Zarzana (license #16239) is REPRIMANDED.
- 2. The Wisconsin nursing license of Angelina Zarzana is LIMITED as follows:

Continuing education

- 3. Within ninety [90] days from the date of this order, Respondent shall submit acceptable documentation of successful completion of the University of Wisconsin School of Nursing on-line continuing education program entitled "Legal Issues for Nurses in Today's Health Care Environment", or of completion of other training preapproved by the Board.
- 4. Within six (6) months from the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit documentation of successful completion of at least six (6) additional hours of continuing nursing education pre-approved by the Board in the subject areas of professional ethics and legal aspects of nursing

- 5. Acceptable documentation shall include:
 - a. Certification from the sponsoring organization;
 - b. A statement signed by Respondent verifying her attendance at and completion of course requirements; and
 - c. If requested by the Department Monitor, proof of successful completion of a post-test acceptable to the Board and/ or submission of other documentation of course content comprehension acceptable to the Board.
- 6. Respondent shall be responsible for all expenses incurred for training and other reporting as required by this order.

7. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the Board as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order, including receiving reports and coordinating all requests for approval of education or other petitions. The Department Monitor may be reached as follows:

Agency Caregiver Finding

8. If Respondent fails to fully and completely comply with all terms and conditions set forth above or if the Department receives a subsequent credible allegation against Respondent of abuse, neglect or misappropriation, the Department Monitor shall without further notice or hearing notify the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services that the findings set forth in this Order shall thereafter constitute an agency finding of neglect for the purposes of secs. 48.685 and 50.065, Wis. Stats. Respondent shall then REFRAIN from any nursing employment in any facility licensed by the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services until such time as Respondent successfully completes a rehabilitation review administered by DHFS.

SUMMARY SUSPENSION

9. Violation of any of the other terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license pursuant to the procedures set forth in Wis. Admin. Code RL Ch. 6. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order.
