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The Medical Examining Board entered its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter on April 22, 2003. By the terms of the board's Order, Dr. Chung was ordered to complete a 24 hour continuing medical education fellowship in the area of diabetic management which had been previously recommended by Metastar, an insurer-approved peer review organization.

Within thirty (30) days of the date of the Order, Dr. Chung was also required to initiate arrangements to undergo an assessment to evaluate her current abilities to practice medicine at her current practice, given her current patient population and the facts of this case. The assessment is to be performed under the direction of the University of Wisconsin Continuing Medical Education Program (UW-CME) or another assessment provider acceptable to the Board, and may include peer interview, oral or written examination, and (if deemed necessary by the assessors) a physical examination. The UW-CME was to notify the Board if and to what extent Respondent's participation in the fellowship referenced above can be utilized in satisfaction of this requirement. If recommended by the assessment, Respondent must participate in and successfully complete an educational program (in addition to the fellowship referred to above) established through the assessment provider to address any shortcomings found in the assessment process.

On September 24, 2003, the board considered evidence that Dr. Chung had completed a one-week diabetic fellowship at the University of Wisconsin Medical School. In reporting completion of the coursework, Richard D. Christianson co-director of the program, stated that no assessment of Dr. Chung's practice was done.

The board also considered Dr. Chung's request, by Attorney Raymond M. Dall'Osto, that the completion of the CME fellowship be considered sufficient to comply with the requirement that Dr. Chung submit to a full assessment. In light of Dr. Christianson's report, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Dr. Chung's request that completion of the one-week diabetic fellowship be deemed to satisfy the requirement that Dr. Chung undergo an assessment to evaluate her current abilities to practice medicine is denied, and Dr. Chung shall undergo the assessment described in the board's April 22, 2003, Final Decision and Order.
