ORDER GRANTING STAY
On April 4, 2002, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of th board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period, wit provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations of the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, the she participate in psychotherapy a minimum of once weekly, and that she participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than 52 times per year.
On July 11, 2002, the board considered Ms. Penewell's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. The board als considered the fact that Ms. Penewell had a positive screen for propoxyphene in June. Accordingly, the board denied the stay.
On September 5, 2002, the board considered Ms. Penewell's request for reinstatement of the stay. Unfortunately, there is evidence that Ms. Penewell again relapsed to the use of propoxyphene on or about August 13, 2002. Accordingly, the board denied the stay.
On June 6, 2003, the board considered renewal of Ms. Penewell's request for reinstatement of the stay. Based upon all informatio of record herein, the board orders as follows:
<u>ORDER</u>
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request of Julie L Penewell, RN, for reinstatement of the stay of the suspension of he license is granted, and the suspension is hereby stayed for a period of three months.
