On September 9, 2003, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Charlene Willis, R.Ph., for a three-month extension of the stay of suspension of her license to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin, as provided within the board's *Final Decision and Order* ("Order") dated October 10, 1995, and a petition that the board increase the hours worked by Willis as a pharmacist in charge. Willis is currently authorized (8) eight hours per week as a pharmacist in charge. Also requested by Willis was an unspecified reduction in individual/group therapy and urine screens. Based upon the foregoing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Charlene Willis, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #11555 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request that the board increase the hours worked by Willis as a pharmacist in charge, is granted for an additional eight (8) hours for a total of sixteen (16) hours per week. Willis may also open and close the pharmacy which may be done consecutively.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request that the board modify the individual/group therapy counseling sessions is granted, to two times (2x) per month, and that the request to reduce the required monthly urine screens from their current level, is denied.
