	ORDER GRANTING RENEWA

On September 12, 1997, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order revoking Mr. Procknow's license to practice as a professional nurse in Wisconsin. By letter dated November 20, 2001, Mr. Procknow applied to the board for reinstatement of his license.

The board and Mr. Procknow thereafter entered into a Stipulation, by which the board agreed to issue, and Mr. Procknow agreed to accept, a limited license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin. The term of the license was to be for three months, with provision for three month renewals of the license based upon compliance with conditions and limitations on the license. Under the terms of the board's Order, which was entered on April 12, 2002, Mr. Procknow is required to participate in a drug and alcohol treatment program, participate in therapy at least once per month, attend AA or NA at least weekly, submit to random urine screens 52 times per year, be responsible for submission of quarterly written reports prepared by his employer and his therapist, practice only under the supervision of another R.N., and refrain from access to controlled substances in his work setting.

In August and November, 2002, and in February, 2003, the board granted Mr. Procknow's requests for three month extensions of his license.

On May 9, 2003, the board considered Mr. Procknow's request for a further renewal of his license, and his further requests for a reduction in the number of required therapy sessions to one per quarter, and a reduction in the number of required urine screens. These latter requests were not supported by Mr. Procknow's therapist. Accordingly, it is ordered as follows:

#### **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the limited license of Randall N. Procknow, RN, is hereby renewed for a period of three months.
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the requested reduction in the number of required therapy sessions and urine screens is denied.
