Sesini Sesini Law Firm 1434 West State Street Milwaukee, WI 53233 On March 19, 1998, the Chiropractic Examining Board (Board) issued a Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the Board's Order, the Respondent's license to practice chiropractic was indefinitely suspended and he voluntarily ceased practicing on June 1, 1996. The Order further provided, among other things, that Dr. Aderholdt would be eligible for three-month stays of suspension if he met certain conditions. On September 18, 2003, Dr. Aderholdt and his attorney, John L. Sesini, appeared before the Board. During his appearance, Dr. Aderholdt reported that he had not practiced chiropractic since his initial suspension was imposed. Accordingly, he has been out of practice for over five (5) years. Dr. Aderholdt requested the return of his license, or, in the alternative, that he be granted a limited one. The Board reviewed Dr. Aderholdt's request and supporting documentation. Based upon the Board's review: IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Dr. Aderholdt shall take and successfully pass the Special Purposes Examination for Chiropractic (SPEC) administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Dr. Aderholdt shall take and successfully pass the chiropractic statutes and rules examination administered monthly by the Department of Regulation and Licensing-Office of Examinations. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that after Dr. Aderholdt has taken and successfully passed the SPEC examination and the chiropractic statutes and rules examination, he will be eligible to receive a three-month stay of suspension. Thereafter, Dr. Aderholdt may apply for consecutive, three-month stays of suspension, which shall be granted upon his demonstrating compliance with the terms and conditions set by the Board. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if the Board grants a stay of suspension to Dr. Aderholdt and he wishes to resume practice as a chiropractor, he must first submit the name of a mentor to the Board chair for his approval. Upon receiving the chair's approval, Dr. Aderholdt may resume practice and his mentor shall file quarterly reports with the Board. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon a showing by Dr. Aderholdt of complete, successful, and continuous compliance for a period of one (1) year with the terms and conditions as set by the Board, Dr. Aderholdt may petition the Board for the reinstatement of his license, without limitations.
