ORDER GRANTING STAY

On May 14, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period. The Order provided that respondent could petition for a three month stay of the suspension at any time, with provision for additional stays conditioned upon respondent's compliance with certain conditions and limitations on her license. Included among these were that respondent participate in an approved drug and alcohol treatment program, that she participate in therapy at least once per week, and that she attend AA or NA on at least a weekly basis. Respondent was also required to participate in a drug screening program consisting of at least one screen per week.

On October 4, 2002, the board granted Ms. Hoberg's request for an initial three month stay of the suspension.

On January 10, 2003, the board considered Ms. Hoberg's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, along with her further request that she be permitted access to controlled substances in her employment setting. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Leslie L. Hoberg is hereby stayed for a period of three months, Ms. Hoberg may petition for further three month stays, which will be granted upon satisfactory demonstration of full compliance with the board's Order during the preceding three month period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the requirement that Ms. Hoberg abstain from access to or administration of controlled substance is hereby terminated, and Ms. Hoberg may have access to, and may administer, controlled substances in her employment setting.
