On November 3, 2000, the board considered Ms. Kassel's further request for stay of the suspension of her license. The board also considered evidence that Ms. Kassel had violated the terms of the board's Order by failing to comply with the both minimum number of drug screens and the minimum number of therapy sessions during the preceding three month period. The board therefore denied the stay by its Order dated November 14, 2000. That Order specified that Ms. Kassel could petition for a further three month stay of the suspension upon demonstration of full compliance with the board's November 5, 1999, Final decision and Order for a period of three months. By its Order dated January 12, 2001, the board denied Ms. Kassel's further request for a stay on the basis that she had not yet demonstrated three months of full compliance.

On May 19, 2000, the board considered Ms. Kassel's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, and granted the extension on that date.

By letter dated March 12, 2001, Ms. Kassel again requested reinstatement of the stay of suspension of her license. The board granted the stay by its Order dated April 12, 2001, and granted additional stays by its Orders dated October 5, 2001, and January 19, 2002, and April 4, 2002, July 11, 2002 and October 15, 2002. The board's January 19, 2002, Order also reduced both the number of required urine screens and the number of therapy sessions to two per month.

On January 10, 2003, the board considered Ms. Kassel's petition for a further stay of the suspension of her license. Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

#### **ORDER**

The request for a three month stay of the suspension of the license of Laurie L. Kassel, R.N., is granted. Ms. Kassel may petition for a further three month stay of the suspension, which shall be granted upon demonstration of full compliance with the board's November 5, 1999, Final decision and Order during the preceding three month period.
