On August 11, 2004, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Mark G. Anderson, R.Ph., for a three month stay of suspension a required by the board's *Final Decision and Order*, (“*Order*”) dated August 9, 2000. Also requested was a modification that would decrease the required frequency of individual/group therapy required by paragraph 2b.(2) to once every twelve to sixteen weeks. (Currently 1x/8 weeks.) Also requested was in increase in the number of hours per week to be worked as a pharmacist in charge to 32, from the current number of 24 hours.

Based upon the board's review of the respondent’s petition and the documents submitted therewith;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that Mark G. Anderson, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #9189 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: the request to decrease the required frequency of individual/group therapy required by paragraph 2b.(2), is denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: the request to increase the number of hours per week to be worked as a pharmacist in charge to 32, is denied.
