On December 8, 2004, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Luigi N. Miceli, R.Ph., for a three month stay of suspension to be granted on his license to practice pharmacy in the state of Wisconsin as provided in the board’s *Final Decision and Order* dated October 10, 2001. (“*Order*”) and that paragraph 2.c.(3) of the *Order* be modified allowing him to be employed as a pharmacist in charge for an additional number of 8 hours per week. (Currently authorized hours as a pharmacist in charge is eight.) Also a request was made to reduce the frequency of individual/group therapy to twice, (2x), per month. Based upon a review of the petition and supporting documentation submitted:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that Luigi N. Miceli, R.Ph., is granted a three month stay of the suspension of license #10794 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that request for modification of paragraph 2.b.(2) of the *Order*, to decrease the frequency of individual/group therapy to twice, (2x), per month, is granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the request for an additional eight hours per week as a pharmacist in charge is granted, for a total of sixteen, (16), hours per week.
