On February 11, 2004, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Donald R. Leetz, for a continued three month stay of suspension as provided in the board’s *Final Decision and Order* dated December 11, 2001. (“*Order*”) . Mr. Leetz also requested that paragraph 2.c.(3) of the *Order* be modified allowing him to be employed as a pharmacist in charge for (8) eight hours per “pay period”. Also requested was that the testing of urine specimens as required by the *Order* be reduced to 48 times each year as provided by paragraph 2.b.(4)b.(3).

Based upon a review of the petition and supporting documentation submitted:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Donald R. Leetz, R.Ph., is GRANTED a three month stay of the suspension of license #10190 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for modification of paragraph 2.c.(3) of the *Order*, is granted, to allow Leetz to practice as a pharmacist in charge for four (4) hours per week. Leetz may open or close the pharmacy but not consecutively.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for modification of paragraph 2.b.(4)b.(3) of the *Order* is granted, and the testing of urine specimens as required by the *Order* be reduced to 48 times each year.
