The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable. Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Tyrone C. Perron, (D.O.B. 09/27/1975), is duly licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice as a pharmacist (license #13336). This license was first granted on October 23, 2000.
2. Respondent's latest address on file with the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 10506 W. Manor Park West Allis, WI 53227.
3. On or about December 4, 2003, Respondent was driving his personal automobile on Interstate 94 in Milwaukee when another driver did something that angered him. In response, Respondent pulled his vehicle up to the left side of the other car, a 1998 Ford Taurus, at the driver's side window of the other car with a pellet gun. The other driver's window broke and the other driver was struck in the face with glass shards.
4. The other driver was a Milwaukee Police Department Detective. The Detective notified authorities and followed Respondent. Respondent was ultimately apprehended.
5. Respondent was taken into custody and searched. Police found two 8 ¼ inch knives concealed in his boots, a pellet gun and an expandable police baton in the passenger compartment, and a .40 caliber Berretta Pistol in the trunk.
6. Respondent told police that he was angry when the car put on its brakes in front of him. He also stated that he had anger management problems.
7. Respondent consents to issuance of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to sec. 450.10, Wis. Stats.
2. The Board is authorized pursuant to sec. 227.44(5), Wis. Stats. to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order and impose following terms and conditions.
3. Respondent's conduct as described above is substantially related to the practice of pharmacy in that it reflects on his ability to interact with the public in a safe and effective manner.
4. Respondent's conduct constitutes grounds for action within the meaning of sec. 450.10(1)(a)2, Wis. Stats.

## **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The stipulation of the parties is approved.
2. The license of Tyrone C. Perron. (license #13336), to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Wisconsin is hereby indefinitely suspended, effective immediately.
3. Mr. Perron may apply to the Pharmacy Examining Board for an order lifting the suspension at any time, but the suspension not be lifted unless the following criteria are met:
  - a) Respondent, at his own expense, shall have undergone a mental health assessment which shall provide proof acceptable to the Board that he does not suffer from any psychological or psychiatric condition which impairs his ability to practice as a pharmacist, including but not limited to anger management or anger control issues.
  - b) The practitioner performing the assessment shall not be a therapist who is treating, or has treated, Respondent. The practitioner must have been approved by the Board, with an opportunity for the Division of Enforcement to make its recommendation, prior to the assessment being performed.
  - c) If the Board determines to lift the suspension, the Board may limit Respondent's license in a manner that addresses recommendations resulting from the assessment, which could include, but are not limited to:
    - i. Psychotherapy, at Respondent's expense, by a therapist approved by the Board, to address specific treatment goals, with periodic reports to the Board by the therapist.
    - ii. Restriction on the nature of practice of practice setting or requirements for supervision of practice, by a professional approved by the Board, with periodic reports to the Board by the supervisor.
    - iii. Requiring Respondent to appear before the Board on an annual basis, to review the progress of any treatment and rehabilitation.
  - d) Any requests for approval of a practitioner to perform the assessment and any evidence required by paragraph 2 of this order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

4. Respondent shall bear all costs incurred as a result of satisfying this Order.
5. Respondent shall pay costs in the sum of \$250 to the Department of Regulation and Licensing within 30 days of the date of this Order.
6. If Respondent believes that the Board's refusal to lift the suspension is inappropriate or that any limitation imposed or maintained by the Board under paragraph 2 is inappropriate, Respondent may seek a class 1 hearing pursuant to sec 227.01(3)(a) Wis. Stat. which the burden shall be on Respondent to show that the Board's decision is arbitrary and capricious. The suspension of or limitations on Respondent's license shall remain in effect until there is a final decision in Respondent's favor on the issue.
7. The rights of a party aggrieved by this Decision to petition the Board for rehearing and to petition for judicial review are set forth on the attached "Notice of Appeal Information."
8. This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
