The parties in these matters agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of the matter(s), subject to the approval of the Funeral Directors Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed the Stipulation agreement annexed to this Final Decision and Order, and considers it acceptable. Accordingly, the Board adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Taylor J. Page (Respondent), whose last known address of record with the Department of Regulation and Licensing (Department) is 114 North Main Street, Potosi, Wisconsin, 53820, is a licensed funeral director (#77-4897). He was granted the license on May 14, 1992, pursuant to Wis. Stat. ch. 458, and has held them at all times material to this complaint. The license is current through December 31, 2005.
- 2. On or about August 8, 2002, Respondent received a letter informing him that Mr. Ronald Johnson wished to change the beneficiary of his irrevocable funeral trust from the Martin Page Funeral Home to the Bendorf Funeral Home. The letter was signed by Ronald Johnson.
- 3. Respondent did not send the irrevocable funeral trust documents to the Bendorf Funeral Home until November 19, 2002. In the interim Respondent made several attempts to contact Mr. Ronald Johnson and insisted on meeting with him to determine if he in fact wished to transfer the trust to the Bendorf Funeral Home and to determine why he wished to do so
- 4. Section 445.125(1)(a)4. Wis. Stats and § FD 3.02(15) Wis. Admin. Code govern irrevocable funeral trusts, and the latter states in relevant part that a funeral director "may not impede the inter vivos designation of a different beneficiary by withholding delivery of a passbook or other indicia of control over funds, or by other behavior."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Funeral Directors Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in these matters pursuant to § 458.26, Stats.
- 2. The Wisconsin Funeral Directors Examining Board has authority to enter into this stipulated resolution of this matter pursuant to § 227.44(5), Stats.
- 3. The Respondent, Taylor J. Page, by his conduct as set forth above violated § 445.125(1)(a)4. Wis. Stats and § FD 3.02(15) Wis. Admin. Code.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. Respondent, Taylor J. Page, is REPRIMANDED for the conduct set out above.
- 2. Respondent shall, within 90 days of the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing costs of this proceeding in the amount of \$1200.00, pursuant to § 440.22(2), Stats.

4. Violation of any term or condition of this Order may constitute grounds for revocation of Respondent's license as a funeral director in Wisconsin. Should the Board determine that there is probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated the terms of this Order, the Section may order that Respondent's license be summarily suspended pending investigation of and hearing on the alleged violation.

The rights of a party aggrieved by this Decision to petition the Board for rehearing and to petition for judicial review are set forth on the attached "Notice of Appeal Information."
