The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Patricia Joanne Schinke (D.O.B. 2/19/67)) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a professional nurse (license #134762). This license was first granted on 4/17/00.
2. On and between at least 1/15/03 and 8/8/03, respondent was employed as a professional nurse at St. Mary’s Hospital, Madison. During this time, on multiple occasions, respondent administered oral pain medications which were controlled substances to patients at a dosage higher than authorized by the prescriber, without charting the dose actually administered (instead charting the dose which had been ordered) and without notifying the prescriber or obtaining authority to do so. Respondent represents to the Board that her sole motive was to improve pain relief for the patients.
3. Respondent has, at Board request, obtained an outpatient assessment which concluded that she is not dependent upon any mood-altering substance, and did not recommend any treatment or educational program.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By the conduct described above, Respondent is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. §441.07(1)(b) and (d), and Wis. Adm. Code § N 7.04(2) and (6).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. Patricia Joann Schinke, RN, is REPRIMANDED for her unprofessional conduct in this matter.
2. The license of Respondent to practice as a professional nurse in the state of Wisconsin is LIMITED as follows:
  - a. Respondent shall certify to the Board the successful completion of an approved course of training in nursing ethics, within 6 months of the date of this order. Within 2 months of the date of this Order, Respondent shall submit to the Board designee an outline of the required training for approval, which shall contain the name of the institution providing the instruction, the name of the instructor, and the course content. The course shall be at least 4 hours in length.

Failure by Respondent to fully and timely comply with the training requirements of this Order shall result in the suspension of Respondent's license to practice as a nurse by staff and without further notice or hearing, until such time as full compliance with the provisions of this Order has been attained.
  - b. Beginning immediately and extending for a period of one year following the completion of the course, Respondent shall arrange for her nursing employer to provide formal written reports to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin 53708-8935 on a quarterly basis, as directed by the Department Monitor. The reports shall assess Respondent's work performance.
  - c. Respondent shall provide her nursing employers with a copy of this Order before engaging in any nursing employment.
3. Respondent shall, upon demand of the Department or any of its duly authorized employees, forthwith furnish a sample of her urine, and/or blood, and/or hair, for testing. This provision of this Order shall not constitute a Limitation upon the license of Respondent.
4. Respondent shall pay the COSTS of investigating and prosecuting this matter, in the amount of \$500, within 60 days of this Order.
5. Pursuant to §227.51(3), Wis. Stats., if the Board of Nursing determines that there is probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated the terms of this Final Decision and Order of the Board of Nursing, the Board may order that the license of Respondent to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin be summarily suspended pending investigation of the alleged violation.
