On October 13, 2004, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Charlene Willis, R.Ph., for a three-month extension of the stay of suspension of her license to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin, as provided within the board's *Final Decision and Order* ("Order") dated October 10, 1995.

Also requested by Willis was an increase in hours that she can work per week as a pharmacist in charge, (currently at 16), and an unspecified modification of her current requirement for individual/group therapy, currently once per month. Her therapist supports individual/group therapy at the frequency of every eight to twelve weeks. Willis' employer indicates that Willis currently works 8 to 12 hours per week as a pharmacist in charge and supports a request for an increase in hours to 24. Willis also requested a reduction in drug screens as provided by the *Order*. Following board review and consideration:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Charlene Willis, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #11555 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request that the board modify the individual/group therapy counseling sessions from the current frequency of one time (1x) per month, is granted, to once every other month.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for an increase in the number of hours practicing as a pharmacist in charge is granted, to 24 hours per week.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the drug screens required by the *Order* are reduced to (4x) four times per month.
