On April 7, 2004, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the petition of Andrew P. Rice, R.Ph., for a three-month stay of suspension, as provided within the board's *Final Decision and Order* (“*Order*”) dated September 21, 1999. Mr. Rice also requested to be allowed to act as a pharmacist in charge for an additional 4 hours per week, for a total of (16) hours per week. Mr. Rice may currently act as a pharmacist in charge for a total of (12) twelve hours per week and may open and/or close the pharmacy but not consecutively. Also requested was a reduction in drug screening from the current minimum of six times per month, to four times per month, as provided in paragraph 2.b.(4)(c) of the *Order*. Based upon the board's review;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Andrew P. Rice, R.Ph., is granted a three month stay of the suspension of license #9594 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request to be allowed to act as a pharmacist in charge for an additional 4 hours per week is granted for a total of sixteen (16) hours per week. Mr. Rice may open and/or close the pharmacy but not consecutively.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for a reduction in drug screening from the current minimum of six times per month, to four times per month, as provided in paragraph 2.b.(4)(c) of the *Order* , is granted.
