The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision and order in this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has recommended the terms of this final decision and order, as stipulated, and finds it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Sandra Marie McNamara (dob:5/28/61) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a registered nurse licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license #87626. This license was first granted on May 15, 1984.
- 2. On January 4, 2001, the Board of Nursing entered an order limiting the respondent's license as result of her inability to practice safely and reliably due to her medical condition.
- 3. The respondent has now indicated that she is unable to work under her limited license due to a physical disability and tha she would prefer to surrender her license until she is able to return to nursing and fulfill the requirements of her limited license.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

A. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §441.07(1)(b)(c) and (d) Wis. Stats. and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation for VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of the respondent's license is accepted.

IT IS FUTHER ORDERED that if the respondent's medical condition should improve in the future and she can return to the active practice of nursing, she may reapply for licensure, which will be subject to the limitations imposed under the Board's original order with credit given for length of treatment already completed.

This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
