On February 9, 2005, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the petition by Thomas G. Pire, R.Ph., for a three-month stay of suspension of his license to practice pharmacy, as provided by the terms of the board's *Final Decision and Order*, (“*Order*”) dated October 10, 2001. Also requested was termination of the weekly individual/group therapy required by the *Order*, and the request was supported by his therapist. On August 13, 2003, the board granted a petition by Pire as follows: *IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the petition to reduce the required weekly individual/group therapy sessions to bi-weekly is granted, CONDITIONED, on the fact that Pire continues to be unemployed as a pharmacist. At such time as Pire obtains work as a pharmacist the weekly individual/group therapy sessions required by the Order shall increase to (1x) once per week.* Pire has accepted a job at Associates Pharmacy to begin June 1, 2004. Therefore, the August 13, 2003 order required his individual/group therapy sessions to INCREASE to (1x) per week. Pire has therefore not yet practiced pharmacy under the terms of the order so as to qualify for a modification in terms thereof. (Order, para. 5) Based upon the board's review of the respondent's petition and the documents submitted therewith;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that Thomas G. Pire, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license # 9468 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the request to terminate individual/group therapy sessions is denied, and Pire is subject to the board's August 13, 2003, order, accordingly, Pire's individual/group therapy sessions remain (1x) once per week.
