On September 7, 2005, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed a petition and supporting evidence submitted by Michael Hiller, R.Ph., in support of a request for the granting of a three month stay of suspension as provided within the board’s *Final Decision and Order*, (“*Order*”) dated August 11, 2004, in case number LS 0408114 PHM. Also requested was a 1) reduction in weekly group therapy sessions as required by paragraph 2.b.(2) of the *Order*; 2) 16 hours per week of work as a pharmacist in charge; and 3) reduction in urine screens to 72 per year. Based upon the board's review of the petition and the documents submitted, the board orders as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that Michael Hiller, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #10177 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the request for a reduction in weekly group therapy sessions as required by paragraph 2.b.(2) of the *Order*, is granted from weekly to bi-monthly.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that eight (8) hours of work per week as a pharmacist in charge is granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the urine screens required by the *Order* are reduced to 72 per year.
