ORDER FIXING COSTS

On March 16, 2005, the Medical Examining Board filed its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter by which the board ordered that pursuant to sec. 440.22, Wis. Stats., the costs of this proceeding be assessed against respondent. Pursuant to sec. RL 2.18 (4), Wis. Admin. Code, on or about March 29, 2005, the Medical Examining Board received the Affidavit of Costs in the amount of \$2,275.07, filed by Attorney John R. Zwieg. On or about March 23, 2005, the Medical Examining Board received the Affidavit of Costs of the Office of Legal Counsel in the amount of \$522.19, filed by Administrative Law Judge Dennis C. Schuh. The Medical Examining Board considered the affidavits of costs on May 18, 2005, and orders as follows:

ORDER


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that pursuant to sec. 440.22, Wis. Stats., the costs of this proceeding in the amount of \$2,797.26, set forth in the affidavits of costs of Attorney John R. Zwieg and Administrative Law Judge Dennis C. Schuh, which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, are hereby assessed against respondent, and shall be payable by respondent to the Department of Regulation and Licensing. **Failure of respondent to make payment on or before June 17, 2005, shall constitute a violation of the Order unless respondent petitions for and the board grants a different deadline.** Under sec. 440.22 (3), Wis. Stats., the Department of Regulation and Licensing may not restore, renew or otherwise issue any credential to the respondent until respondent has made payment to the department in the full amount assessed.

To ensure that payments for assessed costs are correctly receipted, the attached "*Guidelines for Payment of Costs and/or Forfeitures*" should be enclosed with the payment.
