PROCEDURAL HISTORY

A formal Complaint has been filed in this matter. The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Rosalyn [no middle name] Bueger (dob: 11/7/50) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a practical nurse licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license #29545. This license was first granted 12/2/88.
2. On 3/11/02, and while employed as a private duty nurse at the home of patient R., Respondent concealed several pills of the controlled substance alprazolam from the patient's supply. On 11/27/02, Respondent was convicted of theft in the Municipal Court for the Village of River Hills, growing out of this incident.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- A. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 441.07(1)(b),(c), and (d), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- B. The conduct described in paragraph 2, above, violated Wis. Adm. Code § N 7.04(1), (2) and (15). Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, effective the date of this Order, the SURRENDER of the license of Rosalyn Bueger, LPN, to practice nursing in Wisconsin, including any privilege to practice under the Nurse Licensure Compact, is ACCEPTED. Respondent shall not practice nursing in Wisconsin without a license from the Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Costs are not imposed upon Respondent at this time, but if she ever petitions for reinstatement, they shall be paid before her license is reinstated, in the amount then determined by the Board, not to exceed \$2,700.
