PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Lynne R. Jindrick, R.N., Respondent, date of birth October 11, 1954, is licensed by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 78156, which was first granted January 9 1981.
- 2. Respondent's last address reported to the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 22100 Cedar Street, Yuba WI 54634.
- 3. During the events of this matter, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse by Vernon Memoria Healthcare in Viroqua, Wisconsin. In that employment, Respondent provided Hospice/HomeCare services to Ms. A, who was 62 years old and resided at home with her husband in Soldiers Grove, Wisconsin. Ms. A was diagnosed with pancreating gastrinoma with metastasis to the liver.
- 4. During a visit to Ms. A's home on February 9, 2005, Respondent diverted OxyContin/oxycodone tablets which had been prescribed to Ms. A. OxyContin and oxycodone are Schedule II controlled substances, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.16.
- 5. Respondent has admitted to the Division of Enforcement (DOE) that she diverted the OxyContin and oxycodon tablets from Ms. A on February 9, 2005.
- 6. Respondent has also advised DOE that she is in AODA outpatient treatment and has no plans to return t nursing because it would add pressure and stress to her recovery. For this reason, Respondent voluntarily surrenders her licens

to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07 and has authority to enter into this stipulated resolution of this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. Respondent, by engaging in the conduct set out above, has administered, supplied and obtained drugs other tha in the course of legitimate practice and as otherwise prohibited by law and has committed misconduct and unprofessions conduct, as defined by Wis. Adm. Code § N 7.04(2), which subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Sta § 441.07(1)(d).

<u>ORDER</u>

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. The SURRENDER by Lynne R. Jindrick, R.N., Respondent, of her license as a registered nurse in the state c Wisconsin is hereby ACCEPTED.
- 2. If Respondent shall ever apply for any credential from the Board of Nursing, she shall be required to pay to th Department of Regulation and Licensing costs of this proceeding in the amount of \$351.52 pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2 at the time of application.
 - 3. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
