FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Ardie J. Thomas (Applicant) has filed an application for a credential to practice as a private security person in Wisconsin.
- 2. Information received in the application process reflects that on or about June 1, 2005 Applicant was convicted of violation of W Stats. §§ 50.065 and 48.685 [abuse or neglect of a client or misappropriation of a client's property].

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 440.26.
- 2. The facts and circumstances of the arrest referenced above substantially relate to the practice of a private security person. Applicant by her conduct is subject to action against his license pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Ardie J. Thomas is GRANTED a PRIVATE SECURITY PERMIT subject to the following LIMITATIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Anger Management

Within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Order, Applicant shall enter into a program of anger management treatment or training pre-approved as acceptable to the Department. Applicant shall participate in, cooperate with, and follow all recommendations of the provider of this program.

Reporting Requirements

- Applicant shall provide a copy of this Final Decision and Order to her employer in all settings where Applicant works as a 2. private security person.
- 3. Applicant shall arrange for written reports from her supervisor(s) to be provided to Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, as directed by Department Monitor. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that she is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of a private security person and the terms of this Order.
- Applicant shall report to the Department any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change.
- Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of 5. reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant

Scope of practice

6. Applicant shall work only in a work setting pre-approved by the Department or Department Monitor.

DEPARTMENT MONITOR

7. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports and other information required by this Order shall be mailed, e-mailed, faxed or delivered to:

Petitions for Modification

8. Applicant may petition the Department for modification of the terms of this Order after one year from the effective date of this order. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's employer, probation officer and (if applicable) her treatment provider expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. Denial of a petition in whole or in part shall not be considered a denial of a license within the meaning of Wis. Stats. § 227.01(3)(a), and Applicant shall not have a right to any further hearings or proceedings on the denial.

Costs of Compliance

9. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in conjunction with or associated with compliance with the terms of this Order.

Summary Suspension / Additional Discipline

10. The Department may revoke without further notice or hearing or other proceeding Applicant's permit for failure by Applicant to timely comply with the terms of this Order and/or for any further criminal conviction. A violation of this Order may alternatively be the basis for a summary suspension under Wis. Admin. Code § RL 6 or for separate disciplinary action under Wis. Stats. § 440.26(6).
